- To mature into deeper intimacy and friendship with the Triune God
- To develop a theology of Christian spirituality by drawing on and integrating insights from Scripture, theology, historical traditions, psychology and related fields
- To discover the richness of one's own spiritual tradition and the gifts and blessings of other traditions
- To learn about, and engage in, spiritual habits and practices that facilitate spiritual growth
- To grow in balancing prayer, study and service and in developing practical wisdom based on Scripture, tradition, reason, and experience
- To gain experience and skills in providing individual and group spiritual direction in a Christ-centered program and context
- To participate in a creative partnership among Christian spiritual directors in the Southwest

Year Two [For those continuing, focused now entirely on supervised training in spiritual direction]

Costs:

Cost for the two-year program is \$4,000. In the first year, the \$2,300 tuition covers 12 days of instruction and practicum in a church setting, refreshment/snacks and meals [breakfast, lunch, and all but one dinner], faculty resources, administrative costs, reprints and other materials. In the second year the \$1,700 tuition covers 6 days of instruction and practicum, the second event in a retreat setting, refreshment/snacks and meals [breakfast, lunch, and all but one dinner], faculty resources, administrative costs, reprints and other materials, and supervision in monthly group meetings for ongoing evaluation and training. Not included are costs for transportation, overnight accommodations, and fees, if any, for individual spiritual direction and monthly personal quiet days. A \$50 non-refundable processing fee is due with application and \$300 is due at time of admission to the program [to reserve a place—space is limited] and remaining tuition for the Program is due in advance on a yearly, term, or quarterly basis, or by arrangement.

Entry Requirements

Admission is open to individuals [lay or clergy] from any Christian denomination or group who have a bachelor's degree or its equivalent and/or have training or demonstrable knowledge of Scripture and theology. Life experience is highly valued as is awareness of a potential call to be a spiritual director. Admission to the program is granted when the following steps have been completed:

- A completed application submitted by September 1, 2011. Earlier application is encouraged because the size of a class is limited and may be closed before the deadline.
- A \$50 non-refundable processing fee, made out to CFDM-Southwest
- A statement detailing educational background, work experience, Christian journey, involvement in church and Christian service, and interest in spiritual formation and spiritual direction.
- Two letters of reference [one pastoral and one personal]
- An interview with one of the Program Faculty/Staff

Admission to the program is granted by the Admissions Committee [composed of Faculty and Staff of the Certificate Program] following receipt of a completed application and an interview with one or more members of the Admissions Committee.

Tuition: Cost for the two-year program is \$4,000. In the first year, the \$2,300 tuition covers 12 days of instruction and practicum in a church setting, refreshment/snacks and meals [breakfast, lunch, and all but one dinner], faculty resources, administrative costs, reprints and other materials. In the second year the \$1,700 tuition covers 6 days of instruction and practicum, the second of the two events in a retreat setting, refreshment/snacks and meals [breakfast, lunch, and all but one dinner], faculty resources, administrative costs, reprints and other materials, and supervision in monthly group meetings for ongoing evaluation and training. 4. Do you have any theological training (i.e. seminary, bible school, courses, workshops)? Please be specific.
5. How/where did you find out about this program in spiritual formation and direction?
6. What do you hope to receive from this program?
7. What is going on internally within you that is leading you to seek out spiritual formation and direction training?
8. If you are married, describe your spouse's response to your desire to be in this program.
9. Describe your spiritual journey and your relationship with God at this time.
10. What do you see as your strengths? Weaknesses?
11. Describe any steps you have taken or experiences you explore (i.e. counseling, spiritual direction, journaling, group work, etc.) to pursue emotional health and growth.
12. We believe it is God's desire that individuals not only grow in experiential knowledge of God but also in experiential knowledge of self.
